Brief presentation:

Within the framework of reflection on the process of internationalization of law throughout the world, the Franco-Chinese network conduct a study of the French (European) and Chinese models and their contribution to national and international evolution.

Taking account of both the historical role of French (René Cassin) and Chinese (Zhang Pengchun) representatives in drafting the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the increasing role of our two countries at the WTO, this comparison has begun by choosing themes to illustrate the universalism of values and economic globalisation. The network continues to valorise prior exchanges (see the annex listing published work in both languages and references to the training program on "Law in Europe" for young Chinese jurists).

Concerning the chosen themes, the Franco-Chinese ID Network allows the organization of an annual meeting of a small group of high level personalities from these two countries, actors of the internationalization of law and competent academics in these areas, in order to clarify the import / export process of norms in national (French and Chinese), regional (European and Asian) and global (ICJ, ILO, WTO, etc.) spaces.
