Michael F. Hochella, Jr. is University Distinguished Professor at Virginia Tech (Blacksburg, Virginia, USA), concentrating in the area of nano-bio-geo-environmental science on local, regional, and global levels.

He received his B.S. and M.S. from Virginia Tech in 1975 and 1977, respectively, and his Ph.D. from Stanford University in 1981. He has been a professor, first at Stanford, and then at Virginia Tech, for a total of 26 years. He has been a Fulbright Scholar, a Humboldt Award winner, and Virginia Scientist of the Year.

He is a Fellow of eight international scientific societies including AAAS, the American Geophysical Union, and the Royal Society of Chemistry. He is a winner of the Dana Medal (Mineralogical Society of America), the Brindley Lecture Award (Clay Minerals Society), and the Distinguished Service Medal (Geochemical Society).

He is a former president of both the Geochemical Society and the Mineralogical Society of America. Twenty-one of his former advisees are or have been professors at universities in five countries, while others hold prominent positions in national laboratories, industry, and scientific publishing.
