Andreas Beyer, Art Historian, Chair for the History of Art of the Early Modern Era at the University of Basle/Switzerland. Studied at the Universities of Munich, Florence and Frankfurt am Main. Habilitation 1994 at the University of Bonn. He has held professorships at the Universities of Jena and Aachen and was director of the “Centre allemand d’histoire de l’art” in Paris from 2009 to 2014.

Fellow of the Center for Advanced Study in the Visual Arts of the National Gallery of Art in Washington, D.C., The Clark Art Institute, Williamstown and The Getty Research Institute, Los Angeles. Since 2013 he is speaker of the international research-group “Bilderfahrzeuge - Aby Warburg’s Legacy and the Future of Iconology”.

Main research topics are art and architecture of the modern era, political iconology, methodology and the history of the humanities.
