



2012 Study Violent incident affecting Health Care in 22 countries




Health-care providers affected by category

Indirect effects affecting millions across the globe









Issues for global consultations & recommendations

- Rights and Obligations of health care personnel
- Security of Health Infrastructures (collecting experiences from the field)
- Ambulance services in crisis situations
- Army perspective
 - Evacuation of wounded and sick (includes manning Check-points)
 - Conducting searches at hospitals
 - Fighting in proximity of medical infrastructures
- National legislations
- Measures National Society RC/RC can implement regarding their own operations
- Role of civil society and religious leaders



The responsibilities of Health Care Personnel working in armed conflicts and other emergencies :


- International law
