Tricia Meehan is an assistant professor at the Normandy National High School of Architecture and member of the ATE Normandie research team. She also teaches at the Boston University's Parisian site. She graduated in Architecture from the University of Detroit and continued her studies at the Architectural association and at Columbia University. She then received her doctorate in Architecture from the Université Paris 8 (*De la défense des Bâtiments civils : Le renouveau d'une politique architecturale, 1930-1946, sous la direction de J.-L. Cohen*). She gave classes at the Boston Architectural Centre, Columbia University, the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and at the National High School of Architecture of Grenoble and of Paris-Malaquais and Versailles. Her publications on civilian buildings include *Continuité à travers le chaos: La réforme des services de l'Architecture de l'État en France 1930-1946* (2010) et *Parcours croisés : Les Inspecteurs généraux des BCPN, 1930-1960* (2016, to be published).
