Dorothée Imbert is a professor, holder of the Hubert C. Schmidt '38 chair and Head of the Landscape Architecture Section at the Ohio State University. She previously founded and directed the landscape architecture masters scheme of the Washington University in St Louis and that of the Harvard Graduate School of Design. She has worked for the Peter Walker's landscape architecture agency in California and still manages gardens and parks creation projects. She has written *The Modernist Garden in France* (Yale University Press), *Garrett Eckbo: Modern Landscapes for Living* with Marc Treib (University of California Press) and *Between Garden and City: Landscape Modernism and Jean Canneel-Claes* (Pittsburgh University Press), as well as many articles on modern landscaping in the USA and Europe. She has supervised the collection Food and the City: Histories of Culture and Cultivation (Dumbarton Oaks/Harvard). She has also organized many symposiums and exhibitions on modern and contemporary landscaping. She is a member of the Fellowship on Urban Landscapes' advisory board for Dumbarton Oaks.
