

Alain Supiot is Professor Emeritus at the Collège de France, where he held the chair "Social State and Globalization: Legal Analysis of Solidarities" (2012-2019). He is a corresponding member of the British Academy and holds honorary doctorates from several universities (Louvain-la-Neuve, Aristotle of Thessaloniki, Liège, Buenos Aires). Alain Supiot was successively professor at the University of Poitiers and Nantes, member of the Institut Universitaire de France (2001-2012), before being elected to the College de France. He spent several years of overseas research (1981 : Institute of Industrial Relations Berkeley ; 1989/90 : European University Institute Florence ; 1997/98 : Wissenschaftskolleg zu Berlin). From 1998 to 2001 he chaired the National Council for the Development of the Humanities and Social Sciences and from 2017 to 2019 he was a member of the Global Commission on the Future of Work (ILO). He founded, and directed between 2008 and 2013, the Nantes Institute for Advanced Study, which gathers every Year a community of scholars coming both from 'North' • and 'South' • countries. His work has been mainly in two complementary fields: labour law and legal theory. Alain Supiot has published alone or as editor 32 books, often translated into diverse foreign languages.
