## **10. Primary Current Research Projects as Director**

#### *The Viking Phenomenon* (2016-2025, c. \$5 million USD)

- A ten-year investment from the Swedish Research Council in their Distinguished Professorship programme, allowing me to employ up to 15 staff in several countries, exploring the origins of the Viking Age from Late Antiquity to the ninth century. As of December 2024, the project produced 17 books and edited volumes, 112 peer-reviewed journal papers and book chapters, and over 40 popular science articles. Project members have held over 130 international conference presentations and given over 120 public lectures, and featured prominently in popular science programming on Swedish and international TV and in other media.

#### *Centre for the World in the Viking Age* (2024-2028, c. \$3 million USD)

- One of fifteen National Centres of Excellence established by the Swedish Research Council, awarded in competition across all disciplines. Building on the success of the *Viking Phenomenon* project, the grant enables me to establish a key research environment to explore diversity and interaction at the frontiers of the Norse diaspora, with a focus on the east and south. Over the first five years of operation, we are appointing 5 postdocs and 20 international visiting researchers. The Research Council are very pleased with our work so far, and we have already received preliminary indications that the grant will be renewed for another five years, 2029-2033, under similar terms.

### 3. Journal papers and book chapters

#### Notes on impact and citations:

Papers 49 and 56 have been anthologised among the "essential key texts" in the 4-volume Routledge Reader *Medieval Archaeology*, edited by Roberta Gilchrist in 2016. I am one of only five authors with more than one paper included.

Papers 49, 79, 81, and 84 were selected as among the 10 most significant contributions to Viking studies in the second decade of the 21st century, in an online piece from Aarhus University in May 2020.

Paper 49 is the second most cited in the journal *Medieval Archaeology*'s 67-year history.

Paper 80 on the burial of a female Viking warrior was very widely covered online, including reports in *Science*, and reportage in over 130 international news agencies. The paper is in the top 0.01% of global research ever measured by Altmetric, with a highest attention score of 3442, #1 of more than 4000 papers from the *American Journal of Physical Anthropology*, and was the 43rd most accessed piece of scientific research of 2.2 million papers published in the world during 2017. In addition, *Science News* named the find as one of the top 10 scientific discoveries of 2017. Its follow-up article, #91, met with a similar response and is one of the most read papers in *Antiquity*'s history (currently over 73,000 views); Cambridge University Press placed the paper among its '2019 Archaeology Highlights', and its highest Altmetric attention score was 753.

Paper 97, on which I was a member of the core team, was selected by the Archaeological Institute of America as one of the 10 most significant pieces of archaeological research of 2020.
